





Duchesnay Falls Trail is an amazing attraction that lures new adventurers to North Bay every year. This trail, located near the Canadore College and Nipissing University campuses, is a loop of approximately 11.6 kilometres starting as a series of low, picturesque cascades on the river. The river soon breaks into two main channels, each tumbling over several different precipices. The west channel carries well over half of the river's discharge and has two main waterfalls. The lower falls on the west branch are the largest of all at Duchesnay—a chute that falls roughly 8 to 10 metres and is close to the same width at its base.

Come take a stroll down the Kate Pace Way! This 12-kilometre pathway, named in honour of Olympic skier and 'hometown daughter' Kate Pace, is a multiuse trail winding through a variety of environments, including: sections surrounded by trees, streams and nature; municipal parks; roadways, and residential areas; as well as North Bay's beautiful waterfront. Along the waterfront, walkers and runners may choose to take the interlocking-stone sidewalk which curves through seasonal gardens and along beautiful Lake Nipissing, while bikers and bladers continue along the paved pathway. The pathway runs parallel to Lakeshore Drive where you can take a short detour to enjoy lunch or dinner at one of many restaurants.

10 October

Hike through the Laurier Woods Trails for a beautiful nature-filled experience! Laurier Woods encompasses a provincially significant wetland, rocky outcrops and upland forest, and it is a sanctuary to a broad range of wetland and woodland creatures, including migrating birds. A 10+ kilometre trail network spans the woods offering excellent opportunities for hiking and wildlife viewing. Stop at the dipping platform on the lower pond to catch a glimpse of the wetland birds and aquatic life, or have a seat at the Haist Lookout for a birds' eye view. FISHING

Our lake is famous for the plethora of fish and the sport they provide. Of the 44 fish species to be found in Lake Nipissing, the significant include: Northern Pike, Muskie, Walleye, Smallmouth Bass, Largemouth Bass, Gar, Yellow Perch, Cisco or Lake Herring and Whitefish.

Two species deemed to be 'at risk' by the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry are the Northern Brook Lamprey and Lake Sturgeon.

Trout Lake

Tucked into the Canadian Shield and boreal forest, this historic lake is one of North Bay's best kept secrets. The source of the Mattawa River, the Voyageurs knew all about Trout Lake, and traversed it on their passage along historic fur-trading routes.



DINING

The shores of Trout Lake are home to varied culinary delights, that range from home-made fudge and ice cream, to Indian and domestic food trucks, through to fine dining on a lakeside patio.

SWIMMING

Trout Lake is home to two of three supervised beaches in North Bay, Olmsted Beach and Birchaven Cove or as the locals call it "The Cove".

Olmsted Beach is a small beach located at the north end of Trout Lake. Enjoy its beach as well as a tree-covered area great for a peaceful afternoon swim and picnic.

The Cove is an isolated beach area which makes for a beautiful place to swim and take in some of the natural scenery. The sand area is large and a great place for children to play in and lifeguards are on the premises. There is also a dock in the water for swimming.

Explore the NORTH BAY-MATTAWA Conservation Areas

Whether you're looking for a wilderness trail, a sandy beach, or an urban paved bike path, you'll discover it at one of North Bay-Mattawa Conservation Authority's (NBMCA)15 conservation areas and multi-use trailsincluding seven within the City of North Bay.

Grab your hiking boots, bike, paddle, binoculars, fishing rod or camera to conquer, capture, or simply experience the awe-inspiring views and vistas of our northern forests, wetlands and waterways.

Within the City of North Bay, take in the breathtaking view of the city and Lake Nipissing or challenge the trails on your bike at the Laurentian Escarpment Conservation Area. Explore the 240-acre Laurier Woods Conservation Area, where more than 33 species of birds call home and a spectacular array of birds rest up during their spring and fall migration. Walk in the footsteps of history at La Vase Portages and Elks Lodge 25 Family Park Conservation Areas where the First Nations and Voyageurs made their way by canoe enroute between the Great Lakes and the St. Lawrence. Pack a picnic and enjoy the view of the Manitou Islands on Lake Nipissing at the Eva Wardlaw Conservation Area. Looking for a paved path to bike, walk, rollerblade or e-bike as you explore the waterfront or traverse the city? Follow the Kate Pace Way as well as the Kinsmen Trail which features the Chippewa Creek EcoPath.

At the conservation areas throughout the Nipissing region, you'll discover the thundering waterfalls of Eau Claire Gorge, the footprints of glaciers at Corbeil, the spectacular views from Powassan Mountain, the "meeting of two rivers" at Mattawa Island, the trout of Papineau Lake and the joy of nature at Shields-McLaren and Shirley Skinner Conservation Areas, as well as JP Webster Nature Preserve. LAURENTIAN ESCARPMENT

Laurier Woods

The Laurentian Escarpment Conservation Area serves as a starting point for several of the public snowshoe hikes and special events held by the NBMCA throughout the year. This area was originally logged in the 188os and was settled and farmed soon after. Much of the escarpment was cleared at this time, with very little old-growth forest remaining, though some of the regenerated forest stands are in excess of 75 years old.

LAURIER WOODS

Located in the heart of the city, the 240-acre Laurier Woods encompasses a provincially significant wetland, rocky outcrops, upland forest, and is a sanctuary to a broad range of wetland and woodland creatures, including migrating birds.

EAU CLAIRE GORGE

Eau Claire Gorg

NBMCA

The most spectacular scenic feature is the gorge itself, where the Amable du Fond River flows between steep rock walls in a dramatic series of rapids and waterfalls. Below the gorge, the river widens and winds its way through a cluster of islands before flowing into Smith Lake. A self-guided 1.9-kilometre interpretive trail details the natural and human history of the area, including a log slide and dam built on the property in the 1870s for the Mackey Lumber Company. A logger's cabin, found along the trail, was reconstructed in 1989. Please note the cabin is for day use only–overnight stays and campfires are not permitted.

LA VASE PORTAGE

The La Vase Portage is a 14-kilometre route through unspoiled areas with beaver dams and swamps. The three portages together constitute a key link between the Mattawa River flowing east to Lake Nipissing and the French River flowing west into Georgian Bay.



CORBEIL

Corbeil Conservation Area includes part of the historic La Vase River and its floodplain. Recognizing its unique ecological features, NBMCA developed a self-guided, 1.8-kilometre trail which leads visitors across numerous boardwalks and through a variety of landscapes. A number of interpretive sites detail the changes that occurred in the forest over time. A highlight of the walk is a number of interesting rock formations that were created by glaciers during the last ice age.

FUN FACT:

Forest Talk Radio, the Laurier Woods edition, weaves together folktales and forest science to produce an old-fashioned radio comedy experience delivered right to your smartphone as you walk the Orange and White trail. Just download the app, plug in your earbuds, and push GO!

WATERFRONT PARK

Located in North Bay's waterfront area, visitors will enjoy spectacular lake views, walking paths, scenic lookouts, picnic areas and more.

LEE PARK

Near downtown, Lee Park is home to a mounted RCAF CF-100 Canuck jet and the famous Gateway Arch. Built in 1928, the arch acted as a welcome sign and marked the boundary between North Bay and West Ferris. A great place to pack a picnic and spend the day with loads of space for outdoor games.

CHAMPLAIN PARK

Samuel de Champlain first stood at this panoramic location in 1615. Since then, many explorers have caught their first glimpse of Lake Nipissing as they paddled westward on a journey from Montreal to the Great Lakes by way of the Ottawa, Mattawa and French Rivers.

ARMSTRONG PARK

Located at the north end of Trout Lake, enjoy the beach as well as a tree-covered area, great for a peaceful afternoon swim and picnic.

(73.2 km from North Bay, 1 hour) The essence of Algonquin is in its vast interior of maple hills, rocky ridges and thousands of lakes. The only way to explore the interior of this park is by canoe or on foot.

Samuel de Champlain **Provincial Park**

(49.3 km from North Bay, 36 minutes) Located on the historic Mattawa River fur trade route in the scenic Mattawa Valley. This park offers great hiking trails with scenic views and outstanding fall colours.

Manitou Islands Provincial Park

(10 km from North Bay, by boat)

The Manitou Islands are a series of small islands on Lake Nipissing and are part of an eroded volcanic pipe. The islands form a circle and lie 10 kilometres southwest of North Bay by boat.

Restoule Provincial Park

(72 km from North Bay, 1 hour) At the Restoule Provincial Park you can paddle alongside ancient cedars at the base of the 100-metre cliff. When hiking the Fire Tower trail, you will find an amazing view of Stormy Lake. Furthermore, you can mountain bike to Angel Point and the Ranger Point trails.

Mattawa River Provincial Park

(34.7 km from North Bay, 31 minutes) The Mattawa River flows east from Trout Lake (east of North Bay) and enters the Ottawa River at the town of Mattawa. Counting from the head of Trout Lake, it is 76 kilometres in length. The river's name comes from the Algonquin word for "meeting of waterways".

North Bay is home to avid outdoorsy types with a passion for getting back to nature every chance they get.

Forest Bathing

It is said that when humans spend time in a natural setting, especially under the canopy of a forest, they experience rejuvenating benefits to the mind, body and spirit. Want to test this theory out? Take a hike on one of our many trails.

Regional Cycling Tour

This bicycle route follows the Kate Pace Way in North Bay and takes cyclists through the towns of Callander and Corbeil. It is a popular route for local cyclists and is 45 kilometres with ride extensions along the Voyageur Cycling Route adding 30-50 kilometres. Cyclists are warned to be careful choosing a route in and out of North Bay near the Highway 11/17 interchange, as cyclists are prohibited on the bypass.

Snowshoe Trail at North Bay Nordic

From a stream bed to the ridge, through boreal forest and frozen swamp, these trails will provide not only a picturesque and unique perspective on the Nordic setting, but a potentially invigorating tramp to challenge your stamina as well. The Beaver Meadow Loop follows through an early beaver meadow where active beaver lodges are present.





Black Forest Trails

Open May through October, the trail loops through a towering red and white pine forest stand. A series of interpretive signs along the way portray information about the forest's history, tree stands and wildlife found in the park. The trail offers a perfect outing for educational groups, as well as individuals.

EXPLORING + ADVENTURE



La Vase Portages

The La Vase Portages is a 14-kilometre section of the historic Voyageur canoe route, which connects Trout Lake and Lake Nipissing. The route was used thousands of years ago by First Nations in Ontario at the time of European contact. Europeans, including Étienne Brûlé and Samuel de Champlain, learned of the route from Indigenous guides and it was soon established as a major artery into the interior of North America.





Kate Pace Way

A multi-use trail for walking, jogging, cycling, and rollerblading. The pathway winds through a variety of environments, including: sections surrounded by trees, streams and nature; municipal parks; roadways and residential areas; as well as North Bay's beautiful waterfront. Along the waterfront, walkers may choose to stroll along the lock-stone sidewalk which meanders through seasonal gardens and along beautiful Lake Nipissing, while cyclists and rollerbladers continue along the paved pathway. The pathway runs parallel to Lakeshore Drive where pathway users can take a short detour and enjoy lunch or dinner at one of many restaurants.

Education Centre Trails and Duchesnay Falls

These trails will take hikers and cross-country skiers through scenic wooded areas, over creeks on rustic wooden bridges, and past Duchesnay Falls. Located in a beautiful forest behind Nipissing University and Canadore College, and owned by the Education Centre, the hiking trails wind up and down the escarpment. Trail users can check out glacial remnants and tiny fossils. Logged by lumber baron J. R. Booth in the early 1900s, the area still has some large pines and a variety of coniferous and deciduous species. And there's always a good chance you'll see some wildlife on the trails.





Laurentian Escarpment Trails

The extensive network of trails is open to the public year-round offering spectacular views of the city and a mixed terrain. Ranging in length from 1.9 kilometres to 6.4 kilometres, the trails attract a variety of users from mountain bikers and dog walkers to school and community groups.



Laurier Woods Trail

This beautiful trail is located at the end of Brule Street in North Bay. The trail loops through Laurier Woods, which consists of approximately 118 acres of moderately undisturbed upland forest and wetlands habitat. This combination of forest and wetlands provides a variety of habitat for wildlife, and this area is outstanding for birdwatching, with 33 bird species nesting in the woods. The trail offers a great escape from the city, within the city, and is managed by the Friends of Laurier Woods in partnership with the North Bay-Mattawa Conservation Authority.





Otter Lake Trail

After Lake Nipissing and Trout Lake, Otter Lake is the largest lake in North Bay. The Otter Lake area is a pristine, undeveloped, very large natural area with extremely exciting geographical and natural history. It is just 15 minutes from downtown North Bay, making this area possibly the best kept secret of the city. It is an excellent area in which to hike, canoe, camp, orienteer and snowshoe. No buildings exist on the entire shoreline.





North Bay Training Route

Offering a variety of climbs and descents as it winds along North Bay's escarpment, the route is popular for local cyclists training for North Bay's annual triathlon.



North Bay Nordic Ski Club

The extensive network of groomed cross-country ski trails features a variety of ability levels that range in length from o.6 kilometres to 18 kilometres. The facility provides a number of amenities including heated lodge, night skiing and rentals.

Mattawa River

The Mattawa River offers lake and river canoe trips that range from one to four days in length. There are several portages, all shorter than 500 metres, on this relatively short river. This route is suitable for visitors with limited canoe experience, but highly skilled canoeists will also enjoy this route by shooting some of the rapids. The river is navigable in both directions, though canoe trips generally commence upstream, and flow from west to east.

Kinsmen Trail

The Kinsmen Trail is a paved pathway winding for 7 kilometres along Chippewa Creek and EcoPath through the heart of North Bay. The trail makes use of city streets along some sections, but frequent signage and pavement markings make navigation along the length of the trail easy.

The newest addition to North Bay's offerings for touring cyclists is the Voyageur Cycling Route. From end-to-end the route spans 645 kilometres across Northeastern Ontario and will eventually connect to Ottawa. As the name suggests, the Voyageur Cycling Route pays homage to the unique history of the region; it follows the great waterways used for thousands of years for transportation and trade by early explorers and the Indigenous nations before them.

North Bay is the perfect hub for modern-day explorers seeking their own adventure along quiet country roads through the iconic northern landscape. Using the Voyageur Cycling Route as the backbone, cyclists can plan a ride to excite any desire. For the slow rider that likes to soak in the surroundings North Bay's premier trail, the Kate Pace Way provides a perfect blend of urban and nature with ride extensions into the villages of Callander, Corbeil, Astorville and beyond. For the 'hammerhead' looking to log kilometres on a challenging gradient, North Bay's 70-metre escarpment will serve that purpose. Even the gravel rider can find a thrill along the Voyageur Cycling Route (yes—there are cyclists that actually seek out rough roads!). And the best part of the Voyageur Cycling Route? Throwing one back at one of North Bay's microbreweries at the end of a day's ride.





Dionne Quintuplets

The Dionne quintuplets, born May 28, 1934, are the first quintuplets known to have survived infancy. The identical girls were born just outside Callander, Ontario, near the village of Corbeil. When Yvonne, Émilie, Marie, Annette and Cécile Dionne were born, they were an immediate global sensation. At this museum in North Bay, you can learn about their life and legacy.

Military Heritage

Royal Canadian Air Force Station North Bay was founded on September 1, 1951, as part of the efforts to increase Canadian air defence capabilities during the Cold War. More than 65 years later, 22 Wing/Canadian Forces Base (CFB) North Bay remains an essential part of the Royal Canadian Air Force, and the North American Aerospace Defense Command (NORAD).

CFB North Bay has been home to multiple flying squadrons, flying F-86 Sabres, CF-100 Canucks, CF-101 Voodoos, and other aircraft, as part of fighter, trainer and electronic warfare units. North Bay was also host to one of only two BOMARC surface-to-air missile squadrons in Canada—a nuclear-tipped missile designed to destroy enemy aircraft within a 700-kilometre range.

From 1963 to 2006, North Bay's Underground Complex (UGC) was the nerve centre for Canadian air defence operations, with radar coverage from all over Canada feeding into a three-storey building 600 feet below the surface. This captivating air defence history is showcased at the Canadian Forces Museum of Aerospace Defence, located at 22 Wing/CFB North Bay. The museum explores the evolution of air defence from the First World War into modern day operations and is a family-friendly historical experience!

Capitol Centre 90 years of entertainment

The Capitol Centre is North Bay's historic home for arts and entertainment since 1929. It has enjoyed strong community support for 90 years and has outlasted four other theatres in the area. In fact, the Capitol Centre is the only performing arts facility of this size south of Thunder Bay and north of Barrie.

The Capitol Centre includes the Betty Speers Theatre, the WKP Kennedy Gallery, Martini's Lounge and the Galaxy Circle Lounge. The Betty Speers Theatre, which seats 932 people, features the original Spanish architecture—with galaxy motifs adorning the walls and the original chandelier hanging above the majestic balcony staircase. For many years the theatre was predominantly a movie house but over time evolved to include live performances. The Capitol Centre has played host to performers ranging from international artists to Canadian rock royalty, dance companies, Broadway shows, symphony performances, comedy acts and much more!

Just outside the theatre, you'll find a bright concession area where refreshments are provided for visiting patrons. Just down from the concession area is a martini lounge which offers an intimate environment for a drink and conversation. The WKP Kennedy Gallery, located immediately off the main entrance, is a public art gallery that exhibits the finest in historical and contemporary northern, Canadian and international visual artists. The WKP Kennedy Gallery showcases art of all forms and media in two gallery spaces, through public arts activities, in programming with the Capitol Centre and in touring exhibition projects.

The second floor of the theatre houses the Galaxy Circle Lounge, which is a large, elegant ballroom-style room. This unique room features a beautiful baby grand piano, bar area and exquisite works of art gracing every wall. The artwork is part of the WKP Kennedy Gallery's permanent collection.





Celebrating Indigenous culture & heritage

North Bay's vibrant cultural mosaic includes the Indigenous Peoples of the area. One of the best times to experience this is when the North Bay Indigenous Friendship Centre holds its annual powwow in early June. The event has been held at Lee Park in recent years, a well-treed and grassy gathering place in the centre of the city where the iconic Gateway of the North archway lies and RCAF CF-100 plane is mounted on a pedestal. The photos on this page were taken at the 2019 gathering, called Maamwi Kindaaswin -Dancing with Our Ancestors.

Another good time to gain an appreciation of the Indigenous Peoples of North Bay is during the Summer Solstice, with a variety of events across the city on June 21 as part of the National Indigenous Peoples Day celebration.

Regardless of which season you visit North Bay, there are many opportunities to explore and expand your knowledge of this rich heritage with a history pre-dating the city. Archaeological studies around Lake Nipissing indicate occupation of the area by Indigenous people spans nearly 10,000 years. Much of North Bay is actually located on the traditional territory of the Nbisiing Anishinaabeg, of Ojibway and Algonquin descent, with the Nipissing First Nation (NFN) reserve bordering the city's western limits. Its annual powwow takes place on Labour Day weekend, usually held at the Jocko Point sacred grounds, with more than 5,000 visitors during the two-day event.

Other annual powwows and cultural gatherings, with the public welcomed, include those hosted by the Indigenous student services of Canadore College and Nipissing University.

There are 11 separate residential communities in the NFN reserve, which stretches 30 kilometres between North Bay and Sturgeon Falls, with Highway 17 access to each. The closest is Duchesnay Village, named after Duchesnay Creek which features the popular and spectacular Duchesnay Falls.

Several stores in the village offer traditional crafts for sale made by local artists. The largest commercial operation where Indigenous crafts and tipis are featured is five minutes west of the city on Highway 17 called Eagles Nest.



It's beside the Anishinabek Nation headquarters, an impressive facility with four wings for its program departments connecting to a hub in the centre, plus an Elders Hall. The overall facility site is considered an architectural gem and well-worth the time to visit.

Parts of the eastern and southern limits are also recognized as Algonquin Nation traditional territory, which form the long history of North Bay as a key trading centre. A lasting symbol of that heritage is the Fur Harvesters Auction Inc. facility off Gormanville Road. Its annual convention is held in January and attracts trappers and buyers from around the world.

Directly across Lake Nipissing from North Bay is the Dokis First Nation, a reserve located at the head of the French River, feeding Georgian Bay. Dokis and the history of the area is featured during the five-hour Historical Boat Tour offered by the Chief Commanda II, a twin-hulled three-deck catamaran that holds more than 300 passengers. It departs from North Bay's King's Landing Wharf mid-May through mid-September. The ship, and its precursor, The Chief Commanda I, are named after Raymond Commanda, a chief who drowned in the French River in 1944, two years before the original ship launched. The Chief I is now moored beside the North Bay Marina and is a popular restaurant called The Boat.

Also worth visiting, to learn more about the Indigenous heritage of the area, are North Bay City Hall and the North Bay Museum, where special installations celebrate the cultural connection.







Travel Information: Know Before You Go

Crossing the Border into Canada: Land Ports of Entry

Both the Canada Border Services Agency and the U.S. Customs & Border Protection Agencies want you to have a good experience moving through the customs and border protection process.

Learning about traveller entry forms, agricultural products allowed and prohibited, what items are dutiable, and other information will help you move speedily through this process.

Crossing the Canadian Border:

All U.S citizens ages 16 and older, entering Canada by air (including in-transit passengers who are transferring planes in the U.S), land or water, must present one of the following documents: a passport or passport card; an Enhanced Driver's License; or a Trusted Traveller Program Card (SENTRI, NEXUS, or FAST Card). Travellers aged 15 and under require a birth certificate for land or sea travel and a passport for air travel. For current requirements go to: **cic.gc.ca**.

If you are travelling with your own children under the age of 16 and your spouse, bring their birth certificates. If you are traveling with a child other than your own or without your spouse, have the child's birth certificate along with a letter of permission, including name and contact information for that child's parents/guardians or your spouse.

Visitors from all other countries require a valid passport and, in some cases, a Visitor's Visa.

What can and can't come into Canada:

Residents of the United States who visit Canada are allowed to bring in a "reasonable" amount of personal goods duty free. The amount you bring should align with your length of stay.

There are limits for some of the regulated items: alcohol, tobacco and food products. What is and what is not allowed changes frequently – visit inspection.gc.ca for current information prior to your departure.

Pets:

Dogs and cats accompanying their owners from the U.S. must have current (within 36 months) rabies vaccination certificates. Owners from other countries who wish to bring their pets with them should contact 1-800-442-2342 / 1-613-225-2342 / TTY 1-800-465-7735 or visit www.inspection.gc.ca

Residents returning to the U.S.:

Returning U.S. residents are eligible for an \$800 duty-free personal exemption every 31 days, having remained no less

than 48 hours beyond the territorial limits of the United States except U.S. Virgin Islands, in a contiguous country which maintains free zone or port, and has remained beyond the territorial limits of the United States not exceeding 24 hours. This exemption includes no more than 200 cigarettes and 100 cigars. Visit **www.cbp.gov** for more information.

Currency

If you want to know what your money is worth in Canada, visit www.bankofcanada.ca/rates/exchange/ daily-converter/ to quickly convert your currency to Canadian dollars.

Cannabis in Canada

As of October 17, 2018, adults aged 19 and older are legally permitted to purchase, possess (up to 30 grams) and consume cannabis in Ontario. Visitors included.

Cannabis MUST be legally procured through permitted sources (online at **ocs.ca** or at a licensed retail store). You cannot bring cannabis across the U.S/Canada border, in either direction.

Travelling within Canada with cannabis is permitted (laws vary provincially so be aware of the specific regulations applicable as you travel).

In Ontario, cannabis consumption is regulated under the Smoke-Free Ontario act. Be aware of your surroundings and where you can and can't smoke/vape.

Ontario police are authorized to use roadside oral fluid screening devices. Impaired driving is a serious offence in Ontario and drivers shown to be impaired by alcohol, cannabis or any other substance can face stiff penalties including having their vehicle impounded, a loss of driving privileges, significant fines and even jail time. Don't smoke and drive, or boat!




